Celebrating Unity

The 2026 theme, **"Different Roots, One Community"**, speaks to the rich tapestry of cultures, histories, and experiences that make up Exeter and the wider region. In a world often divided by differences, the festival aims to remind us of the strength found in unity, and the shared humanity that connects us all. Our differences should never divide us, they are what make our community strong, vibrant, and resilient. A Weekend of Music, Art, Food and Dialogue

Book-Cycle will be holding storytelling and talks exploring issues of social justice, equality, and inclusion. Multicultural food stalls showcasing global flavours will be spread out across the festival. There will be children's and family activities promoting understanding through creativity. Admission to the festival remains a symbolic fee of £2 and under 16s free of charge, to help sustain the event and support its mission. The Festival is welcoming and accessible to everyone.

AVTAR

Avtar brings Punjabi culture to Exeter Respect with an interactive dance-along. Expect lively Bhangra folk dance with a splash of Bollywood. WREN DEVON YOUTH FOLK ENSEMBLE

Devon Youth Folk Ensemble brings together talented young musicians aged 13–18 from across the South West, performing energetic folk tunes inspired by the rich musical traditions of the Westcountry.

NEON LOBSTERS

Exeter alternative rock four-piece Neon Lobsters blend influences from math rock, jazz fusion, punk and pop to create a distinctive, energetic sound packed with melody and rhythmic intensity.

COMBUSTION BAND

Combustion are a young South West indie rock band combining raw energy, live experience and original songwriting as they establish themselves on the local music scene.

PART MAN PART FISH

Exeter-based one-man post-punk act Part Man Part Fish combines catchy basslines, spoken word and sharp humour to explore themes from modern culture to big tech.

A lively and engaging musical performance celebrating creativity, individuality and community spirit through live music and entertainment.

MAX KROGER – SHINE MUSIC DEVON

Multi-instrumentalist Max Kroger blends piano, saxophone, drums and beatboxing to create emotional, atmospheric performances full of heartfelt melodies and unique musical expression.

ETCHECHURIA

Etchechuria combines delicate harmonies, rich instrumentation and heartfelt songwriting, exploring themes of love, loss and joy through beautifully crafted contemporary folk music.

CAT ROSE

Plymouth folk singer-songwriter Cat Rose delivers intimate storytelling songs with a pure, emotive voice, blending contemporary folk influences with thoughtful, beautifully crafted lyrics.

THE GAIA PROJECT

The Gaia Project is an experimental four-piece blending jazz, psychedelic rock and atmospheric soundscapes, with original songs inspired by the natural elements of Earth, Fire, Water and Wind.

TRICKY SITUATION

Exeter blues four-piece Tricky Situation deliver soulful vocals, blistering guitar solos and a powerful rhythm section, bringing smooth blues and classic rock energy to the stage.

RUSTY SOUTAR

Exeter acoustic duo/trio Rusty Soutar blend blues, folk and indie influences, creating upbeat original songs with strong melodies and inventive musical arrangements.

LEONA WHITFIELD

Emerging 14-year-old singer-songwriter Leona Whitfield combines soulful pop influences with heartfelt songwriting, already earning recognition through multiple releases and features on BBC Introducing.

ZUMBA WITH SARA ANN

Zumba With Sara Ann delivers energetic dance, uplifting rhythms and feel-good atmosphere, inviting audiences of all ages and abilities to join the celebration through movement and music.

DRAWER FULL O'LEMONS

Teen alternative rock band Drawer Full O'Lemons bring high-energy performances inspired by grunge, indie and alternative rock, alongside a growing collection of original songs.

BULLY

Acoustic singer-songwriter Bully combines thoughtful lyrics and expressive guitar work, with music inspired by human rights, storytelling and the emotional power of live performance.

LA BANDITA

Exeter's Latin American cover band La Bandita perform vibrant cumbia, samba, reggaeton and Latin pop, celebrating cultural diversity through energetic live music and dance.

WAZ MUSIC

Pianist and composer Wasim George creates atmospheric melodies inspired by emotion and wellbeing, blending expressive piano performance with the belief that music can heal the soul.

ACAPELLA CALLING

South Devon vocal group Acapella Calling perform uplifting acapella harmonies inspired by pop, folk and gospel, sharing music that celebrates connection, community and joy.

COMMUNITY STAGE

SOUNDWAVES

Soundwaves is an independent music charity supporting neurologically diverse people to explore and create music in a fun, social environment, performing original songs written and created by its members.

COUNTESS WEAR COMMUNITY CHOIR

Formed after the 2023 Coronation street party in Countess Wear, this welcoming community choir brings together around 40 singers performing joyful harmonies spanning ballads, rock and modern favourites.

HIKMAT DEVON CHINESE GROUP

A Chinese Community Dance Group bringing the tradition of China to Exeter, dynamic and vibrant colourful with a unique touch of Chinese cultural flavour.

ILARIA BELLY DANCE

Ilaria Belly Dance based in Exeter and Taunton will bring a mixture of classical and folkloric styles on the Respect Festival's stage. They can't wait to see you all and dance together!

NEWTOWN ROOTS BAND

A community band that makes a big joyous sound playing a variety of folk tunes from around the world with exciting arrangements, energy and fun. All acoustic instruments/all abilities/all ages play in this friendly group.

SWING EXE

A dance community who will be displaying a variety of dance styles from the 1920s, 30s and 40s, with a focus on the Lindy Hop, Charleston and Soho Jazz.

FILIPINO COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION AND FRIENDS

Exeter's vibrant and diverse Filipino community will showcase its rich cultural heritage. The event will feature the traditional Tinikling dance, talented singers, and children's dance performances.

KARINA GRACIA DANCE

Karina & students will perform flamenco dance, accompanied by live guitar from David Nash. Children from Karina's dance clubs at two Devon primary schools will also be performing.

A. K-POP DANCE BY EXESTAR

Ingrid, Sonia, Suhana, Jeeva & Tamila will perform to Magnetic-illit. They moved to the UK with their parents a few years ago and attend local schools/university. They recently performed for Exeter's Hong Kong Community at multiple events, and at Exeter Phoenix, receiving recognition from the Lord Mayor.

UKRAINIAN SINGERS OF PLYMOUTH

This Ukrainian choir has performed across the UK for three years, celebrating Ukrainian heritage while raising awareness and supporting communities through music and song.

DEVON FAITH AND BELIEF FORUM: UNIVERSAL PEACE PRAYERS

This book of Peace Prayers was first presented at a landmark event on 12th November 2016 at the United Reformed Church, Southernhay, Exeter. Shared with schools, colleges, universities, places of worship, NHS hospitals and hospices across the UK, it also reached India, America, Canada, Africa and Singapore. It marks an important step in bringing together people of different faiths and beliefs as fellow citizens of Planet Earth.

THE DEAF COMMUNITY CHOIR

Expect beautiful singing, dancing and signing from this talented group of young people. An inspiring and uplifting performance celebrating the deaf community.

WREN MUSIC

Wren Music helps people of all backgrounds and abilities make music together across Devon. This year, Devon Youth Folk Ensemble performs lively folk tunes, with members aged 13–18, while Exeter Folk Choir sings traditional songs from the UK and beyond.

BULGARIAN SOCIETY DEVON – PENDARI

Bulgarian Society Devon presents the Pendari dance, while Dance Dynamix brings energetic routines designed to be fun and accessible for everyone.

DANCE DYNAMIX

Fun, energetic and inclusive for all ages, sizes, abilities and genders, featuring 80s/90s classics and current hits, promoting dancing yourself HAPPY and feeling great while doing it!

KURDISH GOVENDA DANCE

A traditional Kurdish group dance performed at weddings, festivals and as an act of resistance against oppression.

SING AND SIGN JUKEBOX CHOIR

Sing and Sign Jukebox Choir is a friendly inclusive choir made up of people from the learning disabled community, alongside parents, carers, enablers and professionals. Performing iconic pop songs set to Makaton signs, they love getting audiences singing, signing and dancing along.

GLOBAL HARMONY CHOIR

Global Harmony, a mixed community choir based at Exeter Phoenix, performs songs of celebration and protest from around the world in glorious harmony. From Africa and the Middle East to pop favourites, they bring an eclectic repertoire to the stage.

MAJIDAH TRIBAL BELLY DANCE

Whirling skirts, bright colours, sparkling jewellery and flying tassels — Majidah is a tribal dance troupe whose dancers communicate through movement, creating performances full of energy and vibrancy.

ACOUSTIC NOISE COLLECTIVE

Acoustic Noise Collective is a ukulele group based in Exeter with players of all abilities working hard to create a friendly and inclusive atmosphere in which everyone feels they can participate. Expect well-loved, classic pop and rock songs from across the past five decades.

THE WINDRUSH ZONE

The Stephen Lawrence Stage, positioned at the top of this zone, is curated by our partner Exeter College. This stage isn't just for students and youth; it's a platform for local artists to share their music with everyone.

Newtown Primary School have been making friendship bracelets as a random act of kindness to share with other children and adults in our community.

Scrapstore and Blue Slide offer fun to children and families with lots of activities to enjoy.

Exeter City Football Trust and **Exeter City in the Community** present information about football in the community and fun activities for the whole family to enjoy.

In the play area **Exeter Phoenix** has information about art, Cinema studio 74 and independent cinema, many art projects and art exhibitions.

Exeter Community Alliance is the **Climate Hub** including the **Extinction Rebellion Human Project** who will be displaying information about the environment, printing T-shirts and painting - all on the theme of environmental justice.

Exeter Seed Bank offers activities for Respect Festival 2026 including a Seedling Swap, face painting and craft activity.

The Global Centre will be working with schools and displaying their archives of research they have collected by working with different communities.

Fairtrade showcase their products, supporting the movement and offering an authentic taste of diverse fair trade items.

RAMM employees dressed up as swans will float in between areas, and will display information at Exeter Phoenix's stall.

Libraries Unlimited will display information about libraries in Devon.

Join **Yoga is Therapy with Eva** for healing and stress relieving yoga sessions.

Love from Syria brings their culture through interactive activities with a of the Levant.

Book-Cycle is a UK volunteer-run charity providing free books and educational resources to empower children globally. Their space offers relaxation, book browsing, and diverse storytelling.

DIVERSITY ZONE

The **Devon County Council Communities Team** present information about refugees' resettlement; the support that they provide to different communities in Devon and recruiting volunteers to help teach English to refugees.

The **Devon Ukraine Association**, regardless of the war, will be displaying information and activities for everyone to enjoy.

Visit lots of stalls from around the world displaying their culture and sharing their taste of food including **Refugees Support Devon**, **Ethiopian Link**, **Philippines Community** and the **Egyptian Association** will display their ancient heritage in style alongside their cuisine. The colourful **Bulgarian Community** will share their culture and on their stall including workshops to enjoy. There's presence from South India from the **Exeter Kerala Association**. The **Nigerian Community in Exeter** display information about their activities in Exeter and share the taste of Nigeria. **Multilingua Devon** displays and explains how Devon has been shaped culturally, did you know there are more than 150 languages being used in Devon? **Garland Support** will present their work and run workshops. **Palestinian** stalls will be displaying information sharing the taste of

the Holy Land. The **Kurdish Community** stall presents their culture exhibiting artefacts from their homeland.

Connect Romanian (Exeter and Devon) offers interactive activities to help visitors learn about the local Romanian community. **Afghan Community Devon** will display their embroidery. Join **Devon Faith and Belief** to read poems for World Peace from different faiths and beliefs. Learn more about **Inclusive Exeter CIC's** projects connecting communities and the **Afghan Community** in Exeter cultures through interactive traditional activities. **Hongkongers** in Devon seek to gauge local interest through various Hong Kong-inspired activities at the festival.

Join a retirement celebration on Saturday for an NHS nurse with 48 years of service, hosted by her family at the festival to honor her dedication.

Throughout Sunday, **Wren Music** will host an adaptable "have-a-go" workshop series with acoustic instruments to make an instant band, and a pop up choir to sing songs.

MANDELA STAGE MAIN ZONE
